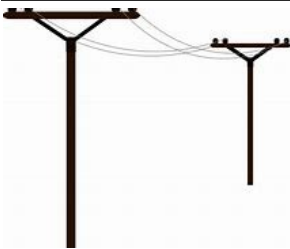

***MYEC HOLDS ANNUAL MEETING OF THE MEMBERS***

Mid-Yellowstone Electric held it's 85th Annual Meeting on Wednesday, March 20th at the Rosebud-Treasure County Exhibit Hall in Forsyth at 6:00 p.m.

During the meeting, members heard reports from their President, Tim Fulton, and CEO, Jason Brothen. Norval Electric Cooperative's Trustee, Chris Christensen, also spoke to MYEC's members. Chris has served as president of the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NRECA) board of directors. Prior to becoming president, Chris served on the board for seven years, and held the positions of vice-president and secretary-treasurer as well. He was the first Montanan elected as an officer of the NRECA board of directors.

Chris spoke to the members about the challenges that cooperatives faced during the pandemic, and the challenges we still have from the after-effects of the pandemic. He talked about the importance of cooperatives working together to get through all of the changes the world is going through, having compassion for our communities, and continuing to have dialogue with our elected leaders. He pointed out the various Trustees in Montana who serve on different boards to keep fighting for the rights of the cooperatives.
